I have heard said in the last couple years, "Raising Masons is not our primary function", usually (ironically) after we have had several degrees in a row. In fact, as a blue lodge, by definition, that is our primary function. Is it our only one? No. Charity, Masonic education, and fellowship are just as important – but raising Masons is our main job. Without it, just through mortal attrition, all blue lodges, appendant bodies, Grand Lodges the world over would eventually cease to exist. They all start with getting Raised in a blue lodge. Masonry hasn't traditionally been a sport for the young, by the way – nearly sixty percent of our members are over seventy. If we don't replace Masons at least at the same rate we are losing them, then the grim statistics above will be inevitable. When someone says, "We should cut back on the number of Degrees we do", I want to climb to the top of our building, lion cub in hand, and sing "Circle of Life". And before everyone jumps on me about focusing on "keeping members", yes – that is critical – and I covered that in my article I wrote in June ("How ya gonna keep 'em down on the Farm"). We always have to work hard at continual improvement regarding retention.

But that's not what I want to talk about. Regarding our primary job, we have been very good at it. In the last three years, we have raised twenty-two Masons. We have also been very good at retaining them, as most of those men have been very active and many have joined our officer ranks. What are we doing right? A lot of things, including regular fellowship nights – but I think it has mainly been the cohesiveness and the connections we have made with each other.

Past Master Matt Wilde – who played football for that school in Ann Arbor – said once he now viewed the members of our Lodge as "his team". I think that is an excellent analogy. We are a team, and as long as you don't diminish or disparage any other lodge in the process, I see no issue with promoting your lodge, your team. We are all on the level and we should always support all the lodges around us (and we do), but taking pride in our Lodge and its successes is a healthy and essential practice. We have a great brand at Birmingham #44, and while we cannot implicitly recruit members, when interested men visit us, they see a very active, close, and enthusiastic lodge, and they want to become a part of us. (Ferndale #506, by the way – our friends and renters – has also done a fantastic job at this, as they have had an impressive increase in membership recently.)

We now very likely will have to find a new home in the next six months. It is stressful, but remember we have been around for 168 years and have moved many times – and survived and thrived. It will be a new adventure, but as long as we stick together, support each other, and regard each of our Brothers as friends and teammates, we will continue to be a thriving and successful lodge. 
We hope that you celebrate this season with joy and respect, never forgetting that you are a pillar of the community and a Man and a Mason!
