

One hundred and seventy-one years is quite a longevity record for most any type of organization, especially one that caters to men who volunteer their time, allegiance, and personal philosophy; however, Masonry is like that. It is built upon the building blocks of prior generations going back in time to antiquity. Birmingham Lodge #44 F&AM is no different, and we are extremely proud of our heritage as a lodge, our members both past and present, and their accomplishments within Masonry. We are also proud of our role and accomplishments in our civic life in Birmingham, Oakland County, and the Great State of Michigan.

Since its founding, Birmingham #44 has been fortunate to have many outstanding Brethren who have been leaders of the community as well as within Masonry. While walking in Downtown Birmingham you will find many a street named after our founding members. Brown, Willits, and Hunter are to name but a few. Alanson Partridge, being one of Birmingham #44's most illustrious Worshipful Masters, was Worshipful Master from 1854-1866, 1868-1869, 1872-1880, and again in 1883. In 1882 he was Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Michigan. Birmingham Lodge #44 owes much of its early success to his efforts. In his civic life, Partridge was a prominent figure in the City of Birmingham as well as in Oakland County, and his picture still hangs prominently on display in **Birmingham's City Hall.**

Birmingham #44 was founded in 1849, when William Brown and others petitioned the Grand Lodge of Michigan for a Charter. The provisional Charter was signed by several Masons, who then belonged to Pontiac Lodge No. 21. but lived in Birmingham. Dispensation for a provisional Charter was granted on April 25, 1850. William Brown was elected its first Worshipful Master and Birmingham #44 held its first Degree on July 18th, 1850. The dispensation concerning Birmingham #44 and making it a regular Chartered Lodge was granted on June 9th, 1851.

Over the years of Birmingham 44's existence, it has been recognized for its fine presentation of Masonic Ritual. Our Lodge has frequently been called upon to perform the entirety of Ritual work for other Lodges. An example of this was in 1927 under the direction of Worshipful Master Clyde H. Wood, when he and 80 Members of Birmingham #44, under special dispensation from the Grand Lodges of Ohio and Michigan, journeyed to Toledo, Ohio to confer the Master Mason Degree for Lotus Lodge #625 in the Commandry room of the Temple in Toledo.

I pay homage to Birmingham Lodge #44's past as I embark on my second stint as Worshipful Master of Birmingham Lodge #44. I do so with respect to our Lodge's past and with a focus on Birmingham Lodge #44's future success. I am honored and humbled by the trust placed in me by Birmingham #44's membership in electing me Worshipful Master for 2023. Myself, with the Officers Elect, look forward to continuing our Masonic Ritual work and to a successful year spreading Brotherly Love, Relief and Truth.

Brothers,

As we head into December and the end of 2022, Birmingham #44's final charity push is here! We need you and your families help to make this a success. Charity is one of the cornerstones of Masonry and I ask that all our members contribute as liberally as possible to it without material injury to yourself. Grace Centers of Hope helps both men and women and their children live better lives. To beat homelessness and drug addiction by giving them a place to live, to heal and learn how to make changes that will better their lives and that of their children. In supporting them, we have three opportunities for both you and your family to get involved in helping.

We are spending \$200 on each and are purchasing items of need such as winter boots, coats, and toys for the children. We will be serving dinner to the women and children who reside at Grace Centers of Hope's Women's Center in Pontiac and we will need about 10 - 15 volunteers to serve and clean up. We have opened this volunteer opportunity to our members and their families to get involved.

The third opportunity to get involved for the charity push this December is baking some Christmas Cookies! Instead of purchasing desert through the caterer for the women and children, I thought it would be a nice touch serving them homemade Christmas Cookies made by our members. This is a great way to show these women and children Brotherly Love from Birmingham Lodge #44's members and families. With 70-80 people to serve we are going to need about 30 dozen cookies! I will be collecting the cookies the week prior to the dinner on the 22nd.

Brothers, please look at the three opportunities we have to serve the less fortunate in our community this Holiday Season. Show love and support to those that often do not believe anyone cares about them. Contact the Secretary or myself and please volunteer for one, two or all three of the opportunities we have to give something to those that need help in our community.
